All About Agriculture

Some see weeds, I see salad By Kathy McGowan

It's been another strange year with winter suddenly turning into summer. Spring took a detour somewhere, and we found ourselves suddenly in summer-like temperatures. Although the weather and soggy soil weren't ideal to plant some crops, I can always count on Nature to provide some food while we get seeds, plants and soils sorted out for the growing season.



Less than 20 feet from our house, I foraged for less than half an hour and found an abundance of wild goodness to make a large salad - all free! Nature provides us with low-calorie, low-carb, nutritious and delicious food; we just need to know what to look for and where to look. Lambs Quarters, purslane, dandelion, chickweed, clover, and wild viola are some of my favourites, and they all grow on our yard. I like having this natural salad garden since it re-seeds, re-grows, and takes care of itself year after year.

These flowers and greens are rich in vitamins and minerals such as selenium, magnesium, copper, iron, Vitamin C, thiamine, calcium, amino acids, and Vitamin A. They can be eaten raw, used as garnishes, pestos, casseroles, soups, quiches, stews and many other culinary dishes. Before diving into foraging head-first, it's best to do your homework and learn about the plant, its benefits and potential side effects; everything in moderation.

Here is one of my go-to recipes:

Purslane Pesto

Ingredients

- A handful of fresh-picked purslane sprigs (washed stems and leaves)
- A few basil sprigs
- 3 whole garlic cloves, peeled
- 1/4 cup sunflower seeds, walnuts, pine nuts or cashews
- Olive oil
- 1/4 tsp salt

Method

- In a food processor or blender, combine the seeds/nuts and the garlic cloves.
- Add the purslane, 2 tablespoons of olive oil, and process until well-combined.
- Add more oil if needed to make the pesto moist and bind together.
- Best eaten fresh. Store in refrigerator (up to three days) or freeze (six months).

Eat the weeds!

STRAWBERRY SUPERMOON!



On Tuesday, June 14 the Strawberry Full Moon will rise above the horizon. For Northern time zones, visibility will come later that evening with a dark clear night. The Supermoon will appear larger and brighter than usual because it is closer to the Earth. The Strawberry Moon name has been used by Algonquin, Ojibwe, Dakota and Lakota peoples for millennia as this is time of ripening of "June-bearing" strawberries. The wild berries are ready to be gathered. Other names for the June Moon include but are not limited to Blooming Moon (Anishinaabe) and Green Corn Moon (Cherokee).

Fire Department

A note from Chief Hole about burning permits:

Now that the snow has gone, we need to be extra careful with our open air burning. **Burning piles of brush or combustibles in an approved/ inspected barrel require an annual burning permit, available from the Gillies Township website: <https://gillies.burnpermits.com/>.** When you apply for the permit, you are required to read and understand the restrictions on open air burning. The most important conditions are that piles of brush or debris cannot be greater than two metres across or two metres tall, and, you cannot light the pile or barrel until two hours before sunset and it must be out two hours after sunrise. If you have having a campfire for cooking, you must keep the fire to less than one metre across. Campfires for cooking are not limited to the time restrictions of a larger open air burn, but must follow all the other safety conditions and be supervised at all times.

Featuring the Snowy Owl

- Males are mostly pure white while females are white with brown markings
- Thick feathers to insulate from Arctic cold make Snowy Owls North America's heaviest owl (about 4 pounds)
- Unlike most owls, Snowy Owls are diurnal (active during the day)
- They mainly eat small mammals like lemmings (up to 1,600 in a single year!)
- **Fun Fact!** Harry Potter's Hedwig is female but was played by male Snowy Owls in the movies

June 19 is also Father's Day this year.

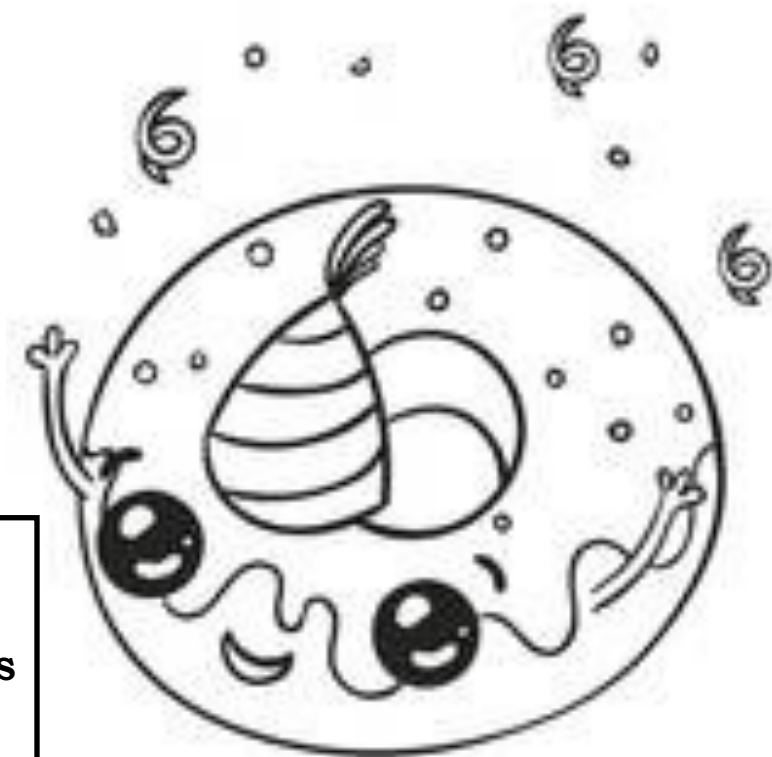

Municipal Election Notice 2022



Municipal and School Board Elections occur every four years in Ontario and the legislation for the conduct of an election are set out in the Municipals Elections Act.

The next regular Municipal Election to elect (1) Reeve, (4) Councillors, and School Board Trustees is on October 24, 2022. The new term of Council begins November 15, 2022 and ends after the municipal election in 2026.

The nomination period for candidates opens on May 1, 2022 and nominations may be filed on any day on or after May 1 at a time when the Clerk's office is open and on Friday August 19, 2022 (Nomination Day) between 9:00 am and 2:00 pm.

To run for municipal office, you must be an eligible elector in the Township of Gillies.

An eligible elector on voting day is:

- A Canadian Citizen ;
- At least 18 years of age at the time you file nomination papers;
- Reside in the Township, or be the owner, or tenant of land in the Township, or the spouse of such owner or tenant; and
- Not prohibited from voting under any law.

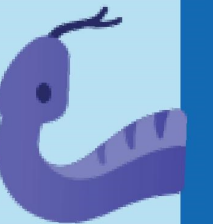
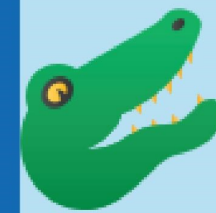
